This half-term has seen a number of changes to the way safeguarding works at Hartshill Academy. The team now consists of:

In addition to the above, we have over 30 DSL-trained staff, including all Senior Leaders and Pastoral Leaders in school, and all of our staff undergo extensive safeguarding training and updates both in-school and through United Learning.

We are committed to safeguarding, supporting the wellbeing and promoting the mental health of our pupils and their families and so far this academic year have been proud to:

- Appoint a trained Senior Mental Health Lead to develop our mental health provision in-school for children and families
- Train and develop staff awareness of promoting good mental health and wellbeing through fortnightly CPD
- Open an Attendance and Safeguarding Hub (A.S.H.) to support pupils in a nurturing setting
- Introduce a range of therapeutic-style interventions, targeted at those pupils who need it
- Train 16 staff as Mental Health First Aiders
- Work closely with the Mental Health in Schools Team, Connect 4 Health and Virtual Schools Outreach to further support our children
- Introduce self-referral pathways such as QR codes so that it is easy to get help when needed




As a school, we want children and families to feel supported and we want to hear from you if there are any concerns you have around the safety or wellbeing of your child.
